

TITLE I PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT**District Expectations**

The Dickinson School District agrees to implement the following statutory requirements:

1. The District will put into operation programs, activities, and procedures for the involvement of parents in all of its schools with Title I programs. Those programs, activities, and procedures will be planned and operated with meaningful consultation with parents of participating children.
2. The District will work with its schools to ensure that the required school-level parental involvement policies meet the Title I requirements, and include, as a component, a school/parent compact.
3. The District will incorporate this district-wide parental involvement policy into its district plan.
4. In carrying out the Title I parental involvement requirements, to the extent practicable, the District and its schools will provide full opportunities for the participation of parents with children with limited English proficiency, parents with children with disabilities, and parents of migratory children, including providing information and school reports in an understandable and uniform format and, including alternative formats upon request, and, to the extent practicable, in a language parents understand.
5. If the district plan for Title I is not satisfactory to the parents of participating children, the District will submit any parent comments with the plan when the District submits the plan to the Department of Public Instruction.
6. The District will involve the parents of children served in Title I schools in decisions about how the one percent of Title I funds reserved for parental involvement is spent and will ensure that not less than 95 percent of the one percent reserved goes directly to the schools. *(NOTE: Only applicable for districts with Title I allocations greater than \$500,000.)*
7. The District will be governed by the following statutory definition of parental involvement, and expects that its Title I schools will carry out programs, activities, and procedures in accordance with this definition:
Parental involvement means the participation of parents in regular, two-way, and meaningful communication involving student academic learning and other school activities, including ensuring:
 - a. that parents play an integral role in assisting their child's learning;
 - b. that parents are encouraged to be actively involved in their child's education at school;
 - c. that parents are full partners in their child's education and are included, as appropriate, in decision-making and on advisory committees to assist in the education of their child;
 - d. the carrying out of other activities, such as those described in section 1118 of the ESEA.
8. The District will inform parents and parental organizations of the purpose and existence of the Parent Information Resource Centers in North Dakota (i.e., Pathfinder Parent Center in Minot, ND).

Parental Involvement Policy Requirements

1. The Dickinson School District will take the following actions to involve parents in the joint development of its district parental involvement plan:

The Parent Advisory Councils in Title I schools will be involved in the development and periodic review of the Title I District Parental Involvement Policy. Parent input will also be obtained through the School-wide Program Planning Teams.

2. The Dickinson School District will provide the following necessary coordination, technical assistance, and other support to assist Title I schools in planning and implementing effective parental involvement activities to improve student academic achievement and school performance:

Information regarding parental involvement activities will be provided to all Title I school personnel through staff meetings and inservice training. The District Parental Involvement and Title I Coordinators will provide coordination, technical assistance and other support, as needed.

3. The Dickinson School District Title I Schools will convene an annual meeting, at a convenient time, to which all parents of participating children shall be invited and encouraged to attend, to inform parents of their school's participation under this part and to explain the requirements of this part, and the right of the parents to be involved.

4. The Dickinson School District Title I Schools will offer a flexible number of meetings, such as meetings in the morning or evening, and may provide, with funds provided under this part, transportation, child care, or home visits, as such services relate to parental involvement.

5. The Dickinson School District will build the schools' and parents' capacity for strong parental involvement, in order to ensure effective involvement of parents and to support a partnership among the school involved, parents, and the community to improve student academic achievement, through the following activities specifically described below:

a. *The District will, with the assistance of its Title I schools, provide assistance to parents of children served by the District or school, as appropriate, in understanding topics such as the following:*

- i. *the state's academic content standards,*
- ii. *the state's student academic achievement standards,*
- iii. *the state and local academic assessments including alternate assessments,*
- iv. *the requirements of Title I,*
- v. *how to monitor their child's progress, and*
- vi. *how to work with educators*

by undertaking the actions described in this paragraph:

Training opportunities will be available to parents addressing the topics indicated above. Information will also be provided through dissemination of the District and school Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) reports and school district profile information, individual student achievement results, school newsletters, the West Dakota Parent and Family Newsletter, parent/teacher conferences and annual notice of the "Parents Right to Know Clause."

- b. The Dickinson School District Title I Schools will provide parents of participating children, if requested by parents, opportunities for regular meetings to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to the education of their children, and respond to any such suggestions as soon as practically possible.
- c. The District will, with the assistance of its Title I schools, provide materials and training to help parents work with their children to improve their childrens' academic achievement, such as literacy training and using technology, as appropriate, to foster parental involvement, by:

Distribution of school and West Dakota Parent and Family Newsletters, brochures, parental access to Power School, parent/teacher conferences, school district websites with links to West Dakota Parent and Family Resource Center and Pathfinder Parent Center and parental involvement/training opportunities.
- d. The District will, with the assistance of its Title I schools and parents, educate its teachers, pupil services personnel, principals and other staff, in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners, in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to implement and coordinate parent programs and build ties between parents and schools, by:

District stakeholders will be educated through building level communication, distribution of school and West Dakota Parent and Family Newsletter, access to parent resources (i.e. Pathfinder Parent Center) and district-wide training opportunities.
- e. The District will, to the extent feasible and appropriate, coordinate and integrate parental involvement programs and activities with Head Start, Reading First, Early Reading First, Even Start, Home Instruction Programs for Preschool Youngsters, the Parents as Teachers Program, and public preschool and other programs, and conduct other activities, such as parent resource centers, that encourage and support parents in more fully participating in the education of their children, by:

Parental involvement programs and activities will be coordinated with applicable school district programs including West Dakota Parent and Family Resource Center, Head Start, and the Regional After School Program (RASP).
- f. The District will take the following actions to ensure that Title I information related to the school and parent- programs, meetings, and other activities, is sent to the parents of participating children in an understandable and uniform format, including alternative formats upon request, and, to the extent practicable, in a language the parents can understand:

Parent feedback will be solicited through survey questions, Annual Review meetings and School-wide Planning Committees to ensure information provided to parents meets stated criteria.

6. The Dickinson School District will coordinate and integrate parental involvement strategies under Title I with parental involvement strategies under the following other programs: Head Start and Regional After School Program (RASP) by:

The Parent Involvement Coordinator will coordinate and integrate parental involvement strategies with applicable programs in our district, Head Start and Regional After School Program (RASP).

7. The Dickinson School District will take the following actions to conduct, with the involvement of parents, an annual evaluation of the content and effectiveness of this parental involvement policy in improving the quality of its Title I schools. The evaluation will include identifying barriers to greater participation by parents in parental involvement activities (with particular attention to parents who are economically disadvantaged, are disabled, have limited English proficiency, have limited literacy, or are of any racial or ethnic minority background). The District will use the findings of the evaluation about its parental involvement policy and activities to design strategies for more effective parental involvement, and to revise, if necessary (and with the involvement of parents) its parental involvement policies.

Evaluation of the parental involvement policy will be ongoing through verbal and written parent feedback at parent involvement activities, parent surveys and information provided at Annual Review and School-wide Planning Meetings.

8. The Dickinson School District will take the following actions to involve parents in the process of school review and improvement:

Parents will be involved through participation in School-wide Planning Committees, Parent Advisory Committees, surveys, and the Title I Annual Review.

Shared Responsibilities for High Student Achievement

As a component of the school-level parental involvement policy, each school shall jointly develop with parents for all children served under this part a school-parent compact that outlines how parents, the entire school staff, and students will share the responsibility for improved student academic achievement.

Parental Involvement Policy Discretionary Components

The district Parental Involvement Policy may include additional paragraphs listing and describing other discretionary activities that the District, in consultation with its parents, chooses to undertake to build parents' capacity for involvement in the school and school system to support their children's academic achievement, such as the following discretionary activities:

1. Involve parents in the development of training for teachers, principals, and other educators to improve the effectiveness of that training.
2. Provide necessary literacy training for parents from Title I, Part A funds, if the District has exhausted all other reasonably available sources of funding for that training.
3. Pay reasonable and necessary expenses associated with parental involvement activities, including transportation and child care costs, to

enable parents to participate in school-related meetings and training sessions.

4. Train parents to enhance the involvement of other parents.
5. In order to maximize parental involvement and participation in their children's education, arrange school meetings at a variety of times, or conduct in-home conferences between teachers or other educators, who work directly with participating children, with parents who are unable to attend those conferences at school.
6. Adopt and implement model approaches to improving parental involvement.
7. Establish a district parent advisory council to provide advice on all matters related to parental involvement in Title I, Part A programs.
8. Develop appropriate roles for community-based organizations and businesses, including faith-based organizations, in parental involvement activities.
9. Provide other reasonable support for parental involvement activities under section 1118 as parents may request.
